

OKLAHOMA TUITION AID GRANT PROGRAM

2021-2022 Application

Only for students NOT eligible to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Complete your OTAG application form as early after October 1 as possible. There is no guarantee that funds will be available to award all eligible applications received through any specific deadline. How early you apply can make the difference in whether or not you receive the award.

Mail the completed application to: Oklahoma Tuition Aid Grant Program, P.O. Box 108850, Oklahoma City, OK 73101-8850. (You will be notified if additional information and documentation are needed.)

The award process usually begins by June 1, and OTAG will send you an informational letter if you have been awarded. If you are not awarded, OTAG will send you a letter informing you of your non-award status and the reason(s) why you were not awarded.
