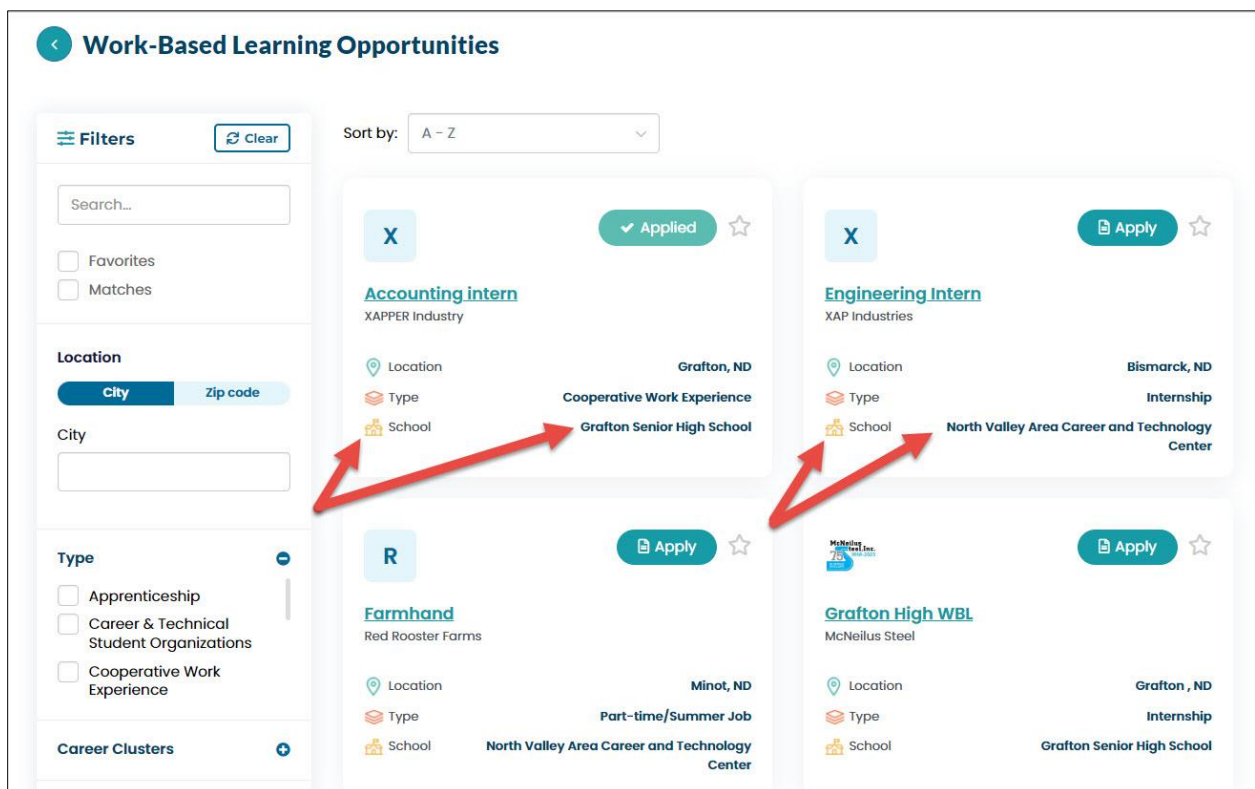

1. WORK-BASED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES ENHANCED FOR STUDENTS BELONGING TO MULTIPLE SCHOOLS

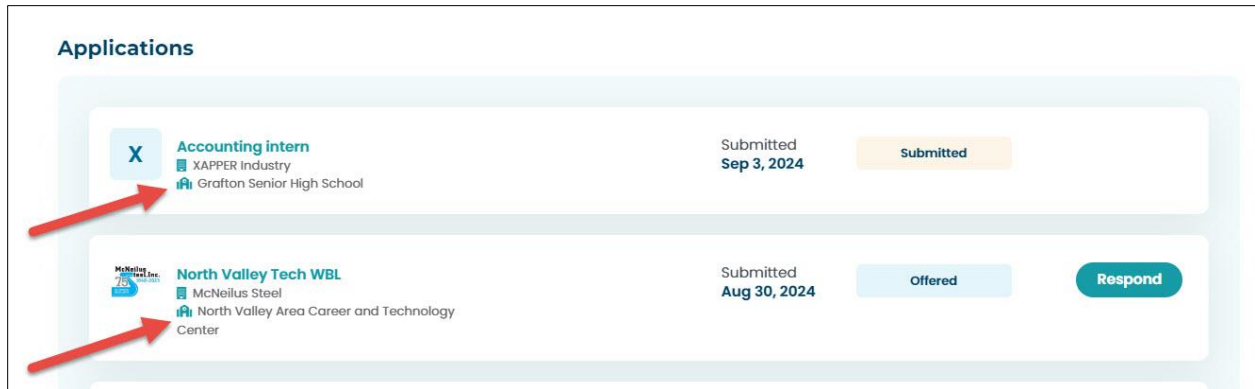
Often students attend more than one school within their district. For example, a student may be attending their local Career and Technical Education center for a welding program while also attending their home high school for all other courses. Both schools may have work-based learning programs with educators managing them. To ensure that students have access to all the possible work-based learning opportunities available to them and to assist educators managing the programs, the work-based learning module has been updated to ensure students belonging to more than one school can see and apply to work-based learning opportunities available through both schools.

Students can:

- See and apply to all opportunities, no matter which school “owns” the opportunity
- View all their completed applications
- Create work-based learning experience activities for all opportunities



Students can see all opportunities from all schools to which they belong



Students have a record of applications to all their applications, no matter which school “owns” the opportunity.

Educators can:

- Manage their own school’s opportunities as they do now
- Manage students’ applications for their own school’s opportunities
- View (but not manage) students’ applications for opportunities managed by another school

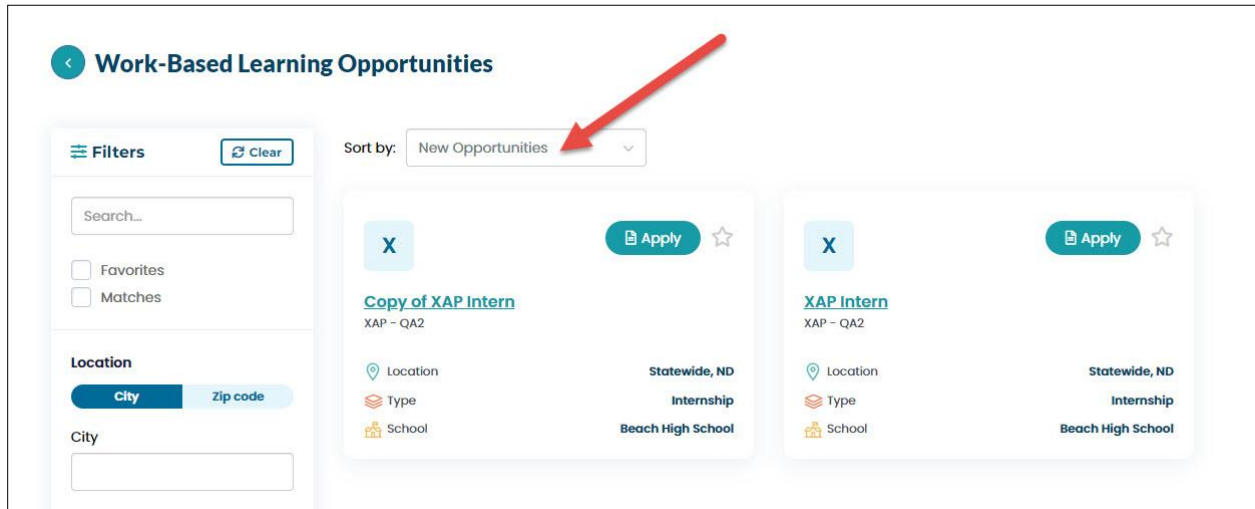
Employers using GPS to manage their work-based learning opportunities will now be able to optionally send work-based learning opportunities to any of the CTE centers in North Dakota. Educators at the centers will have full access to all the work-based learning tools in the RUReady.ND professional center.

Connecting Students to Multiple Schools

XAP is working with ND CTE to add students’ secondary connections (CTE Centers) to their accounts using data files.

2. DEFAULT SORT FOR WORK-BASED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES UPDATED

The default sort order when viewing all work-based learning opportunities has been updated to be by newest. Students benefit by always seeing the most recently released opportunities at the top of their page. Older opportunities can still be easily found by scanning the page or searching.



The default sort for all work-based learning opportunities is now “New Opportunities”
