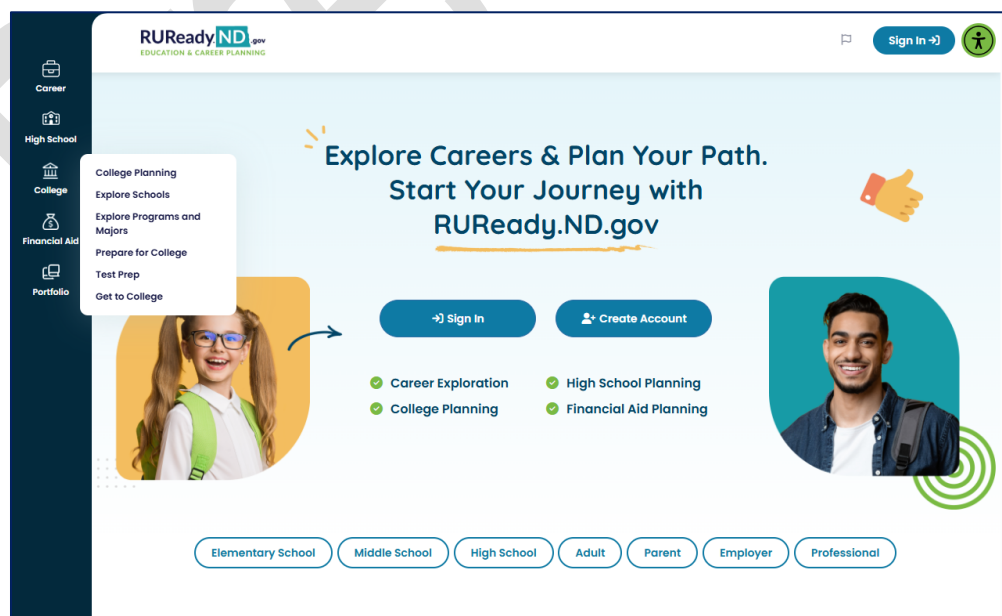

## 1. Smarter Navigation, Same Powerful Tools

We've refreshed the navigation in RUReady.ND.gov to make it easier for you and your students to find what you need—faster and with fewer clicks. The main menu has moved from the top of the screen to a streamlined left-hand sidebar, giving you more space to focus on what matters most.

### Benefits

- **Simplified Navigation Layout** -- The new left-side menu keeps key tools and features in one consistent place—making it quicker and easier to find what you need.
- **Expandable Drop-Down Menus** -- Grouped options and collapsible menus reduce clutter and help you and your students stay focused on relevant tasks.
- **Faster Access to Assigned Curriculum** -- Curriculum assignments are now just a click away, saving time and streamlining classroom instruction.
- **Improved Student Profile Access** -- The expanded profile menu allows students and educators to view key data fields—like goals, plans, and assessments—from anywhere on the platform.
- **A More Intuitive User Experience** -- The updated structure supports smoother navigation for both students and educators, reducing the learning curve and improving engagement.

## 2. New Notification Option for Work-based Learning Applications

Educators can now choose to receive email notifications when a student submits an application for a work-based learning opportunity. This optional feature helps you stay informed and better support your students as they pursue real-world experiences. To start receiving notifications, simply opt in from your educator profile settings in the Professional Center.

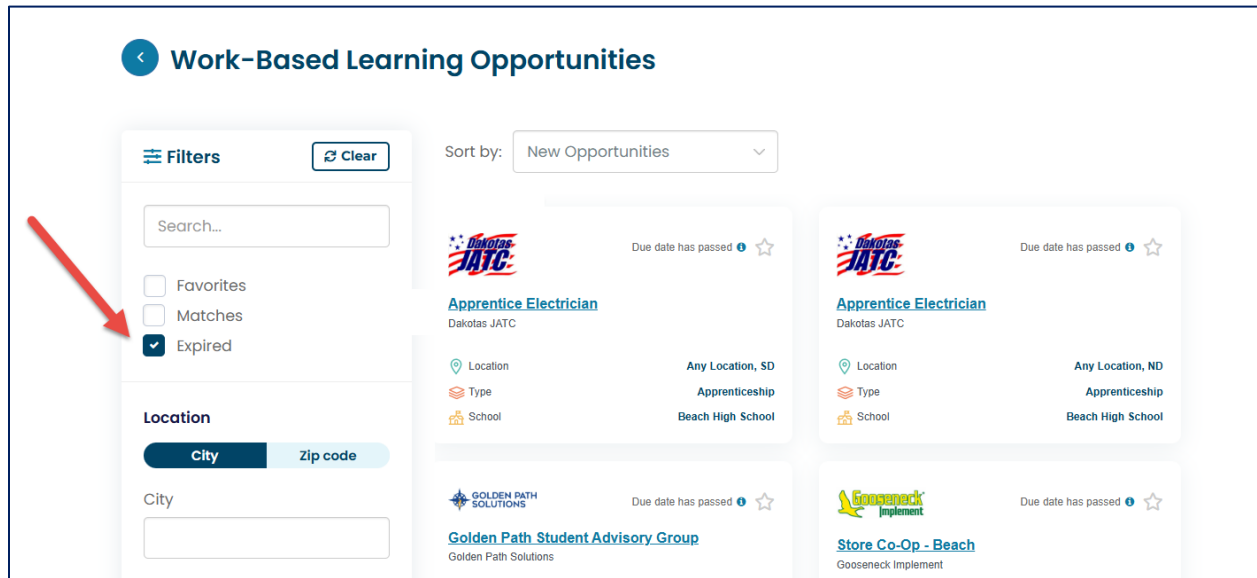
## 3. Improved Display of Work-Based Learning Opportunities

To create a more helpful and less cluttered experience for students, we've updated how expired opportunities are shown:

- Opportunities with past application deadlines are now hidden from the Work-Based Learning landing page and the default view on the All Opportunities page.

- A new filter allows students to view past-due opportunities if needed.
- Sorting has been improved so newer opportunities appear first, while those with older deadlines are pushed to the bottom.

These changes help students focus on current, active opportunities—and reduce confusion caused by outdated listings.

Both activities have been refreshed with a cleaner design and improved navigation, helping students stay focused and move through the content more smoothly.

## National Employment and Outlook

<b>Outlook</b>	<b>stable</b> The employment change from 2023 to 2033 is estimated to be +5%. (The National average for all occupations is +4%)
<b>Job Openings</b>	<b>very small number</b> A total of 1160 average annual openings are expected for this occupation between 2023 and 2033. (The National Average for all occupations is 1,724 openings)
<b>Employment</b>	<b>small occupation</b> This was a small occupation in the United States, employing 96,300 workers in 2023. (The National average for all occupations is 150,944 workers)
<b>Growth</b>	<b>Average growth</b> Employment of airline and commercial pilots is projected to grow as the demand for air travel increases. The post-pandemic expansion of hybrid and remote work arrangements is likely to increase demand for trips that combine business and personal travel, supporting employment demand for pilots.
<b>Non Traditional Occupation</b>	This is a non-traditional occupation for women in 2024.
<b>Industries</b>	Large concentrations of this occupation are found in these industries <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Transportation and warehousing (NAICS48-490) (93.1%)</li> <li>• Air transportation (NAICS481000) (86.4%)</li> <li>• Scheduled air transportation (NAICS481100) (85.6%)</li> </ul>
