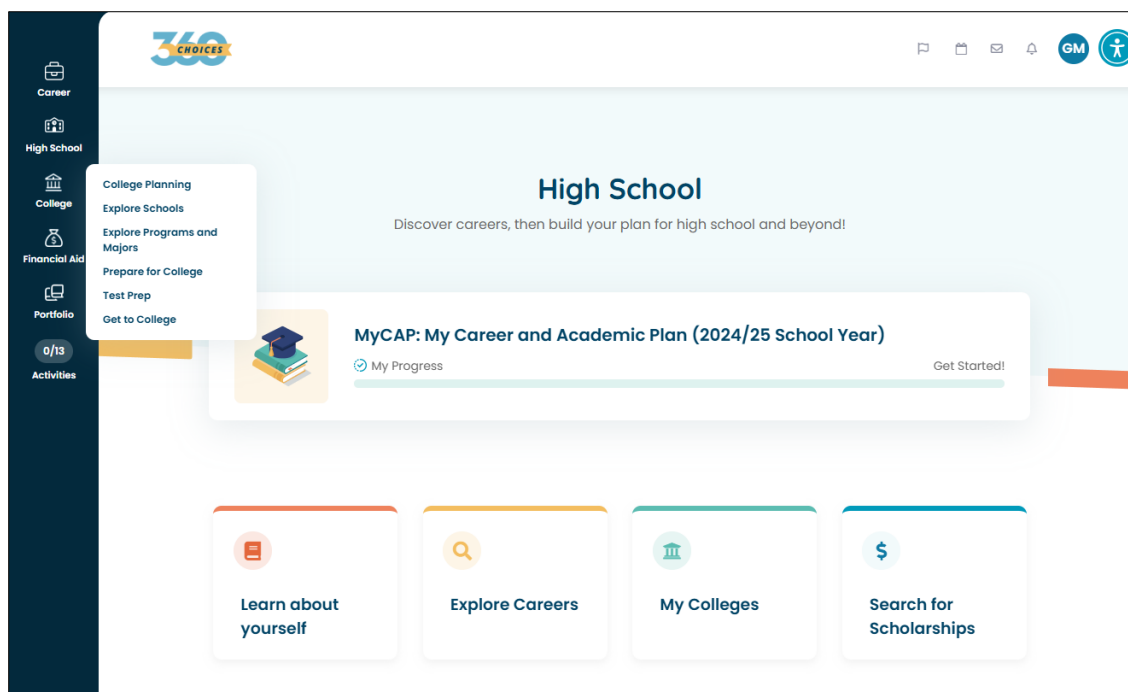

1. Smarter Navigation, Same Powerful Tools

We've refreshed the navigation in Choices360 to make it easier for you and your students to find what you need—faster and with fewer clicks. The main menu has moved from the top of the screen to a streamlined left-hand sidebar, giving you more space to focus on what matters most.

Key updates

- **Simplified Navigation Layout:** The new left-side menu keeps key tools and features in one consistent place—making it quicker and easier to find what you need.
- **Expandable Drop-Down Menus:** Grouped options and collapsible menus on the left-side menu reduce clutter and help students stay focused on relevant tasks. Users can access essential areas of the platform with a single click— from anywhere on the platform.
- **Faster Access to Assigned Activities:** Assigned activities are now just a click away—always accessible from the left-side menu, no matter where you are on the platform.
- **Improved User Drop-Down Menu:** The expanded user menu in the upper-right hand corner allows students to quickly jump to account information—like This is Me, Communication Log, and Account Activity—from anywhere on the platform.



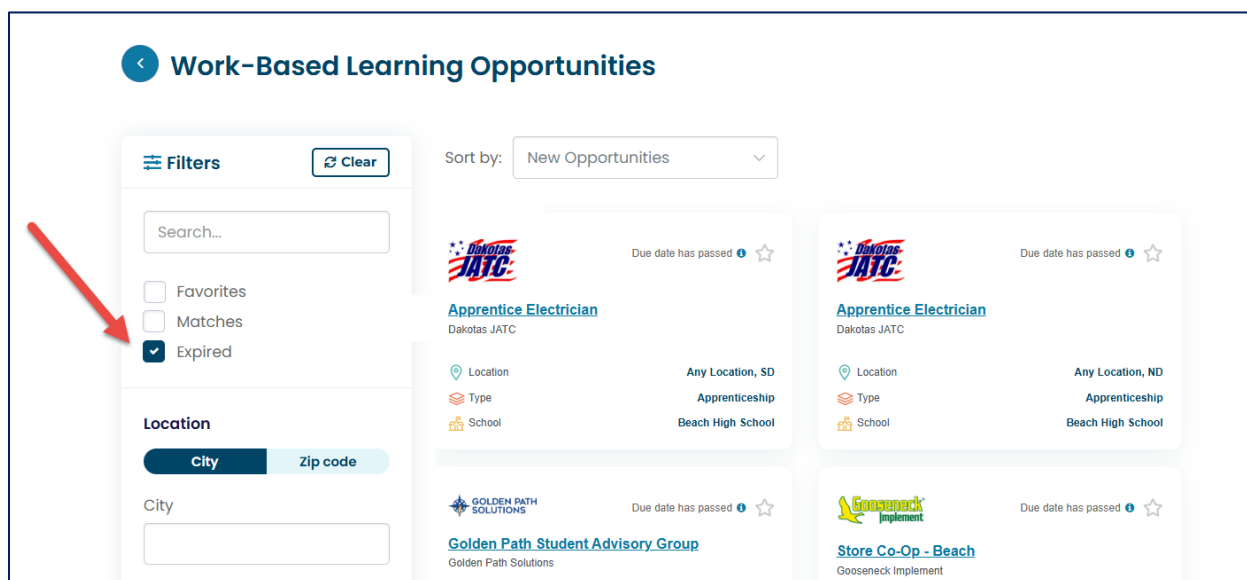
New Choices360 home page with left-side navigation

2. Improved Display of Work-Based Learning Opportunities

To create a more helpful and less cluttered experience for students, we've updated how expired opportunities are shown:

- Opportunities with past application deadlines are now hidden from the Work-Based Learning landing page and the default view on the All Opportunities page.
- A new filter allows students to view past-due opportunities if needed.
- Sorting has been improved so newer opportunities appear first, while those with older deadlines are pushed to the bottom.

These changes help students focus on current, active opportunities—and reduce confusion caused by outdated listings.

- **Updated Look & Feel:** Both activities have been refreshed with a cleaner design and improved navigation, helping students stay focused and move through the content more smoothly.

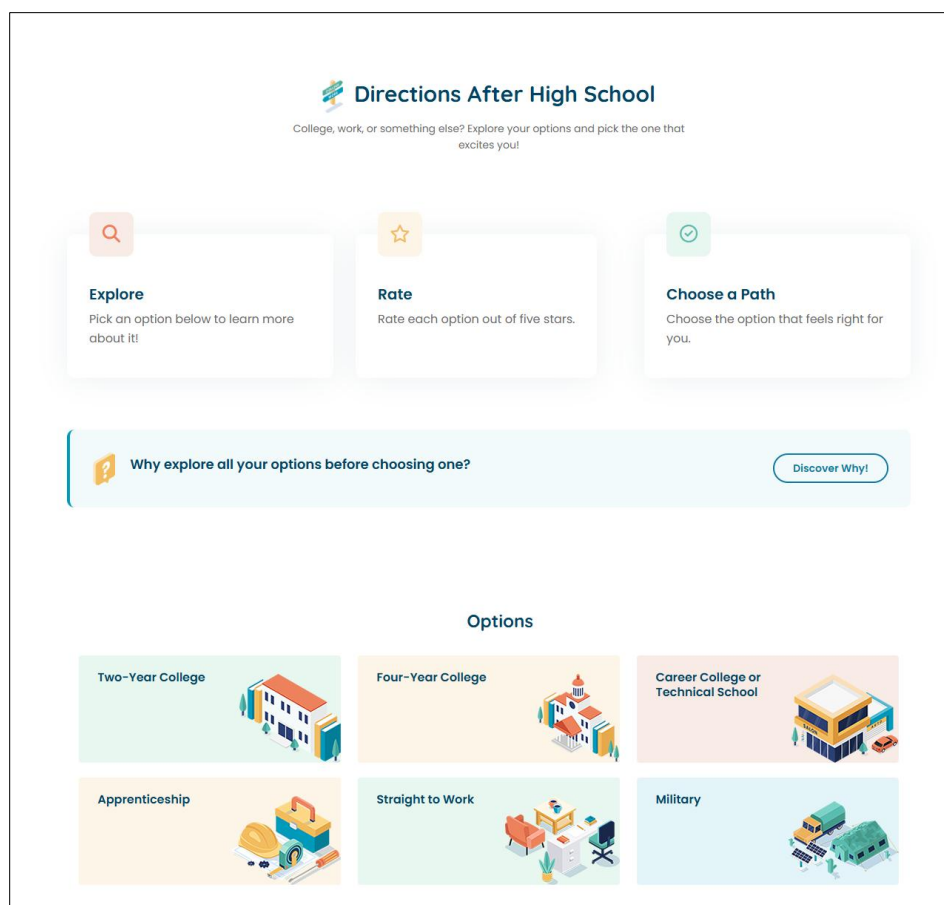

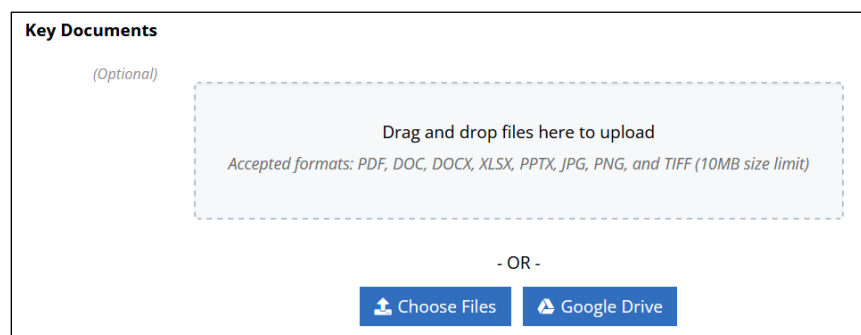
Directions After High School and Career Cluster Map added to Learn About Yourself

National Employment and Outlook

Outlook	stable The employment change from 2023 to 2033 is estimated to be +5%. (The National average for all occupations is +4%)
Job Openings	very small number A total of 1160 average annual openings are expected for this occupation between 2023 and 2033. (The National Average for all occupations is 1,724 openings)
Employment	small occupation This was a small occupation in the United States, employing 96,300 workers in 2023. (The National average for all occupations is 150,944 workers)
Growth	Average growth Employment of airline and commercial pilots is projected to grow as the demand for air travel increases. The post-pandemic expansion of hybrid and remote work arrangements is likely to increase demand for trips that combine business and personal travel, supporting employment demand for pilots.

Bug Fixes & Improvements

- **Security Questions** – The list of security questions has been revised to be more student friendly.
- **Professional View of Student Portfolio** – The assigned activity progress bar has been updated to only reflect the activities assigned in the student’s current grade.
- **Parent Account** – Fixed navigation issue when parent views student’s plan of study and top career choice.
- **Professional View of Student Portfolio** – Fixed navigation and assigned activity (Journal) display issues.
- **Resume Builder** – Completion criteria has been updated for clarity and alerts have been added when students delete their last resume.
- **Merge Accounts** – Uploaded resumes now merge and open properly.
- **Extracurricular Activity** – The error message for the field “Approximate number of weeks spent on this activity each year” has been updated for clarity and improved visibility.
