HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENT: FAFSA COMPLETION

THE LAW

In Oklahoma, seniors must complete and submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) in order to graduate from a public high school. (Senate Bill 93)

If the student or parent prefers not to complete the FAFSA, they may submit an Opt Out form. Students under the age of 18 will be required to have their parent or legal guardian sign the form. If the student is 18 years of age or older, they may submit their own opt out form. Please contact your high school counselor for more information about the opt out form.

FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA)

The FAFSA is a student's first step in applying for federal and most state financial aid. The FAFSA determines the students' eligibility for financial assistance at the college, university, career technology center or proprietary school to which it's sent. Financial aid can include grants, work-study funding, scholarships and federal student loans. Students will complete the FAFSA annually in order to apply for aid.
