







What is COOP Tech/STEP?

- The School of Cooperative Technical Education, or COOP Tech, offers 17 different certification courses in a variety of careers from culinary arts to computer networking. The program has a half-day model where students can attend their DOE high school or GED program for half a day and attend Coop Tech for the other half of the day.
- The Skills Training for Employment Program, or STEP, aims to empower young adults through academic and work-based learning aided by 21st century technology. All students, despite their individual challenges, gain the opportunity to learn in a nurturing and supportive environment to take their first "STEPS" to success. Students attend STEP for a half-day of academic and CTE instruction and off-site internships for the other half-day.

Where are COOP Tech/STEP sites located?

- COOP Tech's main campus is located on 96th and 1st Avenue and has off-site location in Brooklyn, Staten Island and the Bronx.

- HS instruction and RCT preparation
- o Work-readiness skills development, technical training, and paid internships
- o Individualized student plans and support to meet needs of IEP
- o Students attend STEP for half-day academics/CTE instruction and half day off-site internships.

Who can attend?

★ COOP Tech

- Students must be working towards a diploma or GED in another DOE school or program while attending COOP Tech half-day. There are instances where post-grads are served as well.
- For COOP Tech, the student's home school provides academics courses and special education services.

* STEP

 Students 18 years or older with an IEP diploma or an IEP less than 3 credits away from a local/regents diploma

COOP Tech:
